About this manual

This manual contains instructions for installing and using the IBM^{\otimes} High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card. The manual is divided into two parts:

Part 1: Installation and user's guide

This guide contains the product description, and software installation instructions, product use information, and maintenance information.

Part 2: Appendixes

The appendixes contain help information, service information, the product warranties, and notices.

Note: The illustrations in this manual may be slightly different from your hardware.

Introduction

A wireless LAN is a local area network that uses radio frequencies to transmit and receive data between computers or other network devices without wires or cables. A wireless LAN configuration consists of an independent network that is suitable for small or temporary peer-to-peer configurations and infrastructure networks, offering fully distributed data connectivity through micro cells and roaming. The IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is designed to meet the mobility, performance, security, interoperability, management, and reliability requirements of IEEE 802.11b high-data-rate standard. It is easy to install on various devices with a standard PCI card slot. The IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card enables communication with other IEEE 802.11b compliant products to create a wireless network in your office or home.

Part 1: Installation and user's guide

This section provides the product and software descriptions and the installation and user's guide.

Product description

The IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is a standard PCI card that fits into any standard PCI slot. It has one light-emitting diode (LED) indicator and an external antenna. This PCI card is used to create a wireless network that complies with the IEEE 802.11b standard on wireless LANs. It supports data-transfer rates up to 11 Mbps. This PCI card is fully compatible with any other wireless LAN system based on direct sequence spread spectrum (DSSS) radio technology that complies with the IEEE 802.11b standard on wireless LANs. The card supports the following wireless LAN features:


- Automatic Transmit Rate select mechanism in the range of high, medium, standard, and low
- Frequency channel selection (2.4 GHz)
- · Roaming over multiple channels
- · Card Power Management
- Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) data encryption, based on the 64-bit and 128-bit WEP encryption algorithm as defined in the IEEE 802.11 standard on wireless LANs

In addition to this manual, your package contains the following:

- IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card
- One helical antenna
- · One dipole antenna
- The IBM Driver and Utility CD
- Quick Install Guide
- Safety information manual
- · Radio certification flyer

If any of these items are missing or damaged, contact your reseller.

The PCI card is a standard PCI bus card that you can use to install the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card into a computer.



System requirements


Your computer must meet the following requirements to work with the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) card:

- · PCI specification compliant PCI slot
- Microsoft Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows 2000, Windows Millennium Edition (Me) or Windows NT operating system
- A minimum of 5 MB of free disk space for the driver and utility program


Installing the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card

To install the PCI card into your computer, carefully follow these steps:

- 1. Shut down your computer.
- 2. Disconnect the power cords from your computer and all external devices that are connected to your computer.
- 3. Remove the top or side cover of your computer, according to the instructions in the user's guide that came with your computer.
- 4. Select an available PCI slot for the card, and remove the metal filler strip. Keep the screw for mounting the card.



5. Make sure that you remove the antenna from the card, and gently insert the connector of the PCI card into the slot.




- 6. Secure the card into place with the screw that you removed in step 4.
- 7. Install the antenna, see "Installing and removing the antenna" on page 1-3 for more information.
- 8. Replace the computer cover according to the instructions in the user's guide that came with your computer.
- 9. Reconnect all the external devices and power cords to your computer.
- 10. Continue with "Installing and removing the antenna" to complete the hardware installation.


Installing and removing the antenna

There are two types of antennas that could be used with this Wireless LAN (PCI) Card:

• Helical antenna is for the IBM NetVista™ X41 computer



• Dipole antenna is for other IBM or non IBM computers





Attention:

Make sure the computer is off when you install or remove the antenna. Installing or removing the antenna while the computer is on might cause injury or might damage the PCI card. Never operate the High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card without the antenna installed.


Installing and removing the antenna


- 1. Make sure that the computer is turned off.
- 2. Insert one end of the antenna into the antenna connector labeled ANT.





3. Install the antenna by threading it counterclockwise until it is firmly seated. Do not overtighten.





To remove the antenna, reverse the above procedure.


Installing the device driver and software

Make sure that you have completed hardware installation before you turn on your computer and start installing the device drivers and software.

Installing the device drivers in Windows 95, Windows 98 SE, or Windows Me


Use this procedure to install the device drivers:

- 1. Start your computer. When the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is detected, the New Hardware Found window opens.
- 2. Insert the *IBM Driver & Utility CD* into the CD-ROM drive. When prompted, specify that the device drivers are on the CD. Accept all defaults.
- 3. When the installation is complete, two network components will be shown.
 - IBM High Rate Wireless LAN PCI Card
 - TCP/IP IBM High Rate Wireless LAN PCI Card



- 4. Select TCP/IP -> IBM High Rate Wireless LAN PCI Card.
- 5. Click Properties.
- 6. In Microsoft TCP/IP Properties window, specify your network settings. If you do not know howto specify your network settings, contact your

network administrator or Internet Service Provider (ISP).



Installing the device drivers in Windows 2000


Use this procedure to install the device drivers in a computer running Windows 2000:

- 1. Start your computer.
- 2. Click Start → Settings → Control Panel.

3. Double-click Network and Dial-up Connections.




- 4. Right click the active Local Area Connection icon, and click Properties.
- 5. Scroll down the list of components, and select Internet Protocol (TCP/IP).



- 6. Click Properties.
- 7. In Microsoft TCP/IP Properties window, specify your network settings. If you do not know how to specify your network settings, contact your

network administrator or your Internet Service Provider (ISP).



- 8. Click OK.
- 9. Click OK again to close the Local Area Connection Properties window.


Windows will prompt you to restart the computer.

Installing the device drivers in Windows NT driver

Use this procedure to install the device drivers in a computer running Windows NT 4.0:


- 1. Start your computer.

4. Click the Adapters tab.




12. Remove the CD from the CD-ROM drive, and click **Yes** to restart the computer.




Installing IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager

After the device driver are installed and the computer is restarted, use this procedure to install the IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager:

Insert the IBM Driver and Utility CD into the CD-ROM drive. If the
installation program does not start automatically, click Start → Run, type
e:\autorun.exe (where e is the CD-ROM drive letter), and click OK.




2. Click Next.




3. Read the Software License Agreement, and click **Accept** to accept the agreement. If you do not choose **Accept**, you cannot continue this


installation.



Click Next to accept the default destination folder, or you can type the destination folder or select a folder from the list and click Next.



When the installation is complete, click Yes, I want to restart my computer now, and click Finish.



When the computer is restarted, the IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager starts automatically. If it does not start, double-click the **IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager** icon in the system tray in the lower-right-hand corner of the desktop.



Using the IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager

The functions of the IBM Wireless LAN Client manager are on four pages:

- 1. Configuration
- 2. Encryption
- 3. Link
- 4. About

The following sections describe these functions.

Configuration

This section describes the settings on the Configuration page.

Profile

If you are going to use the Wireless LAN (PCI) Card in multiple networking environments that require different configuration settings, you can define a dedicated profile for each environment. For example, you can create one profile for your office and another for your home office.

Each profile has a profile name and contains the network name, network type, communication channel, communication data rate, power-management setting and any encryption keys for the environment. The initial configuration is stored in the default profile.

When you move your computer from one environment to another, you can quickly change the Wireless LAN (PCI) Card settings by selecting the profile for the new environment.

To create a new profile, simply type the name that you would like for the profile and make the appropriate selections in the IBM Wireless LAN Client

Manager window.



Mode

You can select between two modes:

• Infrastructure - An infrastructure network consists of wireless workstations that are interconnected through one access point or through multiple access points and a wireless backbone.



 802.11 AdHoc - An AdHoc network consists of workstations within mutual communication range of each other through the wireless medium.



SSID

To join your computer to an existing network that includes access points or to set up an AdHoc network, select or type the network name in the SSID field. If the Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is operating in Infrastructure mode, use the infrastructure network name, or if you want the Wireless LAN (PCI) Card to connect any IEEE 802.11 infrastructure network it can find, use the name ANY (all capital letters).



Transmit Rate

Select a transmission rate:

- Auto 1 or 2 Mb
- 5.5 Mb

- 11 Mb
- · Fully Automatic

Note: Fully Automatic selects the transmission rate that is optimal for the network environment.



Power Save Enabled

To enable power management, select the Power Save Enabled check box.



AdHoc Channel

The **AdHoc Channel** field is available only if you have selected 802.11 AdHoc in the Mode field. Select a channel number from 1 to 14. In some countries,

only 11 channels might be available.




Encryption (WEP)

This section describes the settings on the Encryption page.

Select Disabled to disable encryption. Select $64\ bit$ or $128\ bit$ to enable encryption.

Create Key with Passphrase

This window allows you to enter a generic phrase consisting of any characters that takes the pass phrase and generate random keys automatically for you.





Create Key Manually

If you have enabled encryption and select this option, specify up to four different keys to decrypt data that is received by your computer through the wireless network. The keys must be hexadecimal values. If you have selected 64-bit encryption, specify 10-digit hexadecimal values (for example,

ABCD123456). If you have selected 128-bit encryption, specify 26-digit hexadecimal values (for example, ABCD123456ABCD123456987654). The only valid character entries are 0-9 and A-F.





Default Key


Select the key that will be used to encrypt packets that will be transmitted from your computer.





Link Status

This section describes the settings on the Link page.



State

This field displays the current connect status of the computer. The status can be any of the following:

- · The current station is disabled
- · Searching for initial connection
- Associated (connected to a network)
- Reassociation (a current association is being transferred from one access point to another)

Current channel

This field displays the number of the communication channel that is being used by the network to which the computer is connected.

Current Tx Rate

This field displays the data rate (in Mbits/sec) that is being used for data transmission. If the Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is operating in AdHoc mode, this field will not show the correct value, because the field displays the date rate only for the first frame.

Throughput

This field displays the throughput rate (in bytes per second) of transmitted (Tx) and received (Rx) data.

Link Quality

This field displays the quality communication in relation to the network to which the computer is connected.

Signal strength

This field displays the strength of the signal in relation to the network to which the computer is connected.

About


This page displays the version and build date of each component of the IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager.



Adjusting the antenna orientation to get better performance

The default antenna orientation pointing straight up, generally provides the best signal strength and quality. Look at the icon tray and adjust the orientation of the antenna so that the optimal connection is achieved as described in "Understanding the IBM Wireless LAN Client Manager System

tray icon".

Radio characteristics

Wireless communication is often subject to local radio regulations. Although the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is intended for operation in the license-free 2.4 GHz band, local radio regulations might impose limitations on the use of wireless communication equipment. To comply with such regulations, the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card has dedicated channel sets, with a number of factory-programmed channels identified by the following abbreviations:

- ETS: For countries that adhere to the regulations as defined by the European Telecommunications Standards Institute (ETSI)
- FCC: For countries that adhere to the regulations as defined by the US Federal Communications Commission (FCC)
- · FR: For France
- JP: For Japan

The abbreviations of the channel set that is supported by your IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is printed on a label on the back of the card.

The range values shown in this table are typical distances as measured under laboratories conditions. These values might vary according to the actual radio conditions at the location where the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is installed.

In a semi-open office environment, work space is assumed to be divided by shoulder-height, hollow wall elements. Antennas are at desktop level.

The range of the wireless signal is related to the transmission rate of the wireless communication. Communications at lower transmit rates might travel larger distances.

The range of wireless devices can be affected when the antennas are placed near metal surfaces or solid, high-density materials. Range is also affected by obstacles in the signal path of the radio that might either absorb or reflect the radio signal.

Supported frequency sub-bands

Subject to the radio regulations that apply in your country, your IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card might support a different set of 2.4 GHz channels. Contact your authorized IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card reseller or IBM Sales representative for information about the radio regulations that apply in your country.

When installing IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card, the channel configuration is managed as follows:

- For wireless clients that operate in a high rate wireless LAN infrastructure, the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card automatically starts operation at the channel that is identified by the access points. When roaming between different access points, the station can dynamically switch to another channel if required.
- In computers that operate in a Peer-to-Peer workgroup mode, the IBM High Rate Wireless (PCI) Card uses channel 10 by default.

Troubleshooting the LEDs

When installing and using the IBM High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card the following errors might occur:

- A component of the High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card prevents the card from establishing a connection with the network
- A configuration mismatch prevents the High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card from establishing a connection with the (correct) network
- Absence of or conflict with the High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card device driver
- The PCI slot prevents the High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card from receiving power
- The High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card conflicts with another device.

The starting point to solving a problem with your High Rate Wireless LAN (PCI) Card is to look at the LED activity of the card. The following table provides an overview of the various modes of operation and the associated LED activity. The table also include a number of troubleshooting actions that might help you solve the problem.

	If you cannot connect to the network while the LED indicates that the network is working properly, the TCP/IP settings of your network might not be set properly. In this case, contact your network administrator or your Internet Service Provider (ISP) to help you solve the problem.

This warranty statement consists of two parts: Part 1 and Part 2. Be sure to read Part 1 and the country-unique terms in Part 2 that apply to your country or region.

Part 1 - General Terms

This Statement of Limited Warranty includes Part 1 - General Terms and Part 2 - Country-unique Terms. The terms of Part 2 replace or modify those of Part 1. The warranties provided by IBM in this Statement of Limited Warranty apply only to Machines you purchase for your use, and not for resale, from IBM or your reseller. The term "Machine" means an IBM machine, its features, conversions, upgrades, elements, or accessories, or any combination of them. The term "Machine" does not include any software programs, whether pre-loaded with the Machine, installed subsequently or otherwise. Unless IBM specifies otherwise, the following warranties apply only in the country where you acquire the Machine. Nothing in this Statement of Limited Warranty affects any statutory rights of consumers that cannot be waived or limited by contract. If you have any questions, contact IBM or your reseller.

The IBM Warranty for Machines

IBM warrants that each Machine 1) is free from defects in materials and workmanship and 2) conforms to IBM's Official Published Specifications ("Specifications"). The warranty period for a Machine is a specified, fixed period commencing on its Date of Installation. The date on your sales receipt is the Date of Installation unless IBM or your reseller informs you otherwise.

If a Machine does not function as warranted during the warranty period, and IBM or your reseller are unable to either 1) make it do so or 2) replace it with one that is at least functionally equivalent, you may return it to your place of purchase and your money will be refunded.

Extent of Warranty

Items Not Covered by Warranty

IBM does not warrant uninterrupted or error-free operation of a Machine.

Any technical or other support provided for a Machine under warranty, such as assistance via telephone with "how-to" questions and those regarding Machine set-up and installation, will be provided WITHOUT WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND.

Warranty Service

To obtain warranty service for a Machine, contact IBM or your reseller. If you do not register your Machine with IBM, you may be required to present proof of purchase.

During the warranty period, IBM or your reseller, if approved by IBM to provide warranty service, provides without charge certain types of repair and exchange service to keep Machines in, or restore them to, conformance with their Specifications. Limitation of Liability

Circumstances may arise where, because of a default on IBM's part or other liability, you are entitled to recover damages from IBM. In each such instance, regardless of the basis on which you are entitled to claim damages from IBM (including fundamental breach, negligence, misrepresentation, or other contract or tort claim), except for any liability that cannot be waived or limited by applicable laws, IBM is liable for no more than


